
## National Coastal Assessment: Virginia ORD/VA-DEQ/CBP/Region 3/OW

Background

The U.S. EPA's National Coastal Assessment (NCA) Program, is a multi-year partnership among EPA's Office of Research and Development (ORD), EPA's Office of Water (OW), EPA's Regional Offices, all coastal states, and selected territories. As part of this effort, ORD initiated a coastal monitoring program with the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (VA-DEQ) in 2000. Now in its third year, this program integrates elements of existing Virginia estuarine and coastal monitoring and assessment efforts, including data provided from the Chesapeake Bay Program (CBP). The joint effort is determining the condition of estuarine waters in Virginia and allows comparison to other U.S. coastal areas. This collaborative effort is being coordinated by the ORD National Health and Environmental Effects Research Laboratory's Gulf Ecology Division in Gulf Breeze, Florida.

## National Coastal Assessment Strategy

The National Coastal Assessment is a strategic partnership among EPA, the coastal states, and other federal agencies. Each state uses a compatible probabilistic design and a common set of environmental indicators (see Table below)



to survey its coastal resources and assess their condition. These estimates can then be aggregated to assess conditions at the EPA regional, biogeographical, and national levels. All data will be made available for public access on the Internet. The map above shows the estuarine waters of Virginia and the locations of sampling sites for the 2002 survey, including CBP sites.
