


EPA's FY 1986 BUDGET SUPPORTS:

- A SUPERFUND INCREASE OF MORE THAN 45% WHICH WILL INCREASE THE NUMBER OF SITE CLEAN-UPS CONDUCTED BY THE AGENCY
- A MAJOR INCREASE IN THE NEWLY REAUTHORIZED RCRA PROGRAM
 - 26% DOLLAR INCREASE
 - 10% WORKYEAR INCREASE
- A 61% DOLLAR INCREASE IN THE ACID RAIN PROGRAM
- A SIGNIFICANT EXPANSION OF THE ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM ESPECIALLY IN THE SUPERFUND AND HAZARDOUS WASTE PROGRAMS.
 - \$34 MILLION INCREASE
 - 278 WORKYEAR INCREASE
- A STRENGTHENED RESEARCH PROGRAM
 - \$19 MILLION INCREASE
- A STEADY COMMITMENT TO STATE GRANTS

OUR TOTAL RESOURCES INCREASE BY 8% OVER THE FY 1985 LEVEL




THE AGENCY'S TOTAL DOLLARS INCREASED BY \$339 MILLION OVER FY 1985





(\$ IN MILLIONS)




THE ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM INCREASES \$34 MILLION AND 278 WORKYEARS




IN THE AGENCY'S R&D APPROPRIATION, OUR INVESTMENTS IN ACID RAIN, TOXICS AND PESTICIDES, AND HAZARDOUS WASTE RESEARCH INCREASE BY \$46 MILLION OVER THE 1985 LEVEL



ADDITIONS TO THE AGENCY'S RCRA PROGRAM DURING 1985 AND 1986 HAVE AMOUNTED TO ALMOST \$120 MILLION AND 400 WORKYEARS



INCREASES TO THE AGENCY'S SUPERFUND PROGRAM DURING 1985 AND 1986 HAVE ALMOST DOUBLED THE PROGRAM
