## About the IRD.....

### Distribution Plan

This is the first distribution of the Information Resources Directory (IRD) which was developed by the Office of Information Resources Management (OIRM). In the future, the IRD will be distributed semi-annually along with the EPA Headquarters Telephone Directory.

### Updating Schedule

The IRD will be updated every six months (in the summer and fall) so that you will have access to the most current information. We are asking for your assistance in keeping the directory current. An *IRD Information Update Form* is included in the directory for you to complete and submit to OIRM. Although OIRM welcomes comments throughout the year, we are especially interested in receiving your comments by March and November to support the summer and fall revisions of the directory.

### IRD Information Update Form

Each section of this directory is formatted differently to present the information in the most useable fashion. It is important that you provide all of the information required to revise the particular IRD section. Clarification of the three sections of the *IRD Information Update Form* is outlined below, it is most important that all three sections are completed before submitting the form.

- I. **Information Reviewer.** We need to know who is submitting the information and how to reach that person in case we have questions. The Information Reviewer is not necessarily the person listed as the IRD Contact.
- II. **Resource Information.** We need to have all information relevant to the resource you are using to submit revisions. It is important that you format all information to be consistent with the IRD section you are updating. If you require additional space to provide this information, feel free to provide attachments.
- III. **Contact Information.** This is the person that will be listed in the IRD as the official contact for the resource. We need to have their name, EPA office, phone number, and EPA mail code; if the contact is not at EPA, we need their name, phone number, mailing address, and the name of their agency.

### *When All Else Fails. . .*

*This portion of the General Reference Section provides responses to many common requests for information resources. Access to good sources for basic information about the Agency is provided by the Public Information Center (PIC). PIC is willing to distribute informational documents to the general public from any and all program offices. PIC encourages program offices to send documents of potential interest to the general public to PIC for distribution. This section should be referred to when all else fails.*

#### Annual Budget (EPA)

A copy of EPA's Annual Budget is usually available by February for the following fiscal year. The Office of the Comptroller provides both a summary document as well as the entire justification of appropriation estimates for the Committee on Appropriations.

A copy of the Budget or Summary of the Budget can be obtained by calling 475-8340.

#### 'Annual Report' (EPA)

EPA does not produce a comprehensive annual report per se. The closest thing to an Agency-wide annual report is the Council on Environmental Quality's Annual report. This report can be obtained by calling CEQ at 395-5750.

Some individual program offices produce their own "annual reports". Among that group are the following offices: • ORD, • The Inspector General's Office, • OSWER, and • OW .

#### Environmental Impact Statements

There are numerous sources where Environmental Impact Statements may be obtained. The following sources may be referenced:

- *Headquarters Library:* The Library maintains an index of Environmental Impact Statements on microfiche.
- *Office of Federal Activities:* The Office of Federal Activities handles the Agency's environmental impact statements.

#### Environmental Statutes

Copies of environmental legislation may be obtained from a number of sources:

- *Corresponding Dockets:* Many dockets have copies of legislation related to their particular focus. (For example, the RCRA/CERCLA Docket has copies of the Superfund Amendments, etc.)
- *Program Offices:* Some program offices that do not maintain dockets often have copies of pertinent legislation available.
- *Government Printing Office:* This Office has copies of all legislation available free of charge. You can request copies of any and all legislation by sending a written request to the Government Printing Office.
- *Congressional Document Room:* Copies of Legislation, Reports, Bills, and Slip Laws can be obtained by writing to either of the following addresses:

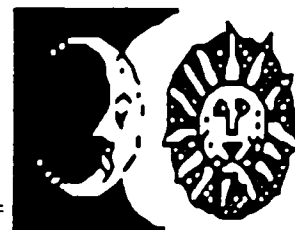

#### Superfund Risk Assessment Information Directory (March '87)

### **Guide to the Headquarters Library Reference Section**

#### **LIBRARY COLLECTIONS**

The EPA Headquarters Library has a multidisciplinary collection including books and reports on environmental issues, law, policy, regulations, computer technology and business. In addition to the Main Collection, several special collections, journals, microforms, and indexes provide users with a wide variety of information resources.

#### **HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION**

The Hazardous Waste Collection consists of books, journals, EPA reports and OSWER directives. It is shelved as a separate collection and does not circulate. Access is provided through the library catalog as well as a user friendly microcomputer database.

#### **MANAGEMENT COLLECTION**

The management collection consists of books, journals videotapes, audiotapes and Federal agency reports. It is shelved as a separate collection with copies of the quarterly management bibliographies and newsletters. The library catalog can be used to identify books by subject, author, and title.

#### **MICROFICHE COLLECTIONS**

A variety of information is available at the library on microfiche. The "Pathfinder to the Microfiche Collection at the Headquarters Library" is available near the microfiche readers and explains the types of collections available. Two important collections are described below:

#### **CONGRESSIONAL INFORMATION SERVICE**

CIS identifies, collects and indexes the working papers or publications of congressional committees and subcommittees. The CIS Abstracts located in the Indexes and Abstracts section of the library provides detailed indexes to the legislation, hearings and committee prints which are available in the microfiche collection.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENTS**

The microfiche collection of environmental impact statements contains documents prepared by federal agencies regarding the impact of their proposals for legislation and other action which affect the quality of the environment. These documents are indexed in the EIS Digest of Environmental Impact Statements, located in the Abstract and Indexes section of the library.

## JOURNAL COLLECTION

The journal collection consists of current periodicals covering research and development, environmental subject areas, policy, news, and government activities. Access to journal articles is provided through a variety of journal indexes such as Chemical Abstracts, Environmental Bibliography, Public Affairs Information Service (PAIS) as well as through computerized literature searches for EPA employees.

## VERTICAL FILES

A collection of articles, brochures, and interesting news items is available near the circulation desk covering popular environmental topics. This is a good place to start for general information on newsworthy environmental topics. This file is useful for quick reference and is also used heavily by students and people with a general interest in a certain issue.

## REFERENCE COLLECTION

The reference collection contains books and directories intended to answer a variety of questions. The following lists a few of the most useful and frequently used sources:

### Directories

Encyclopedia of Associations  
*Gale Research Company*

This directory contains a comprehensive listing of organizations covering 18 broad subject areas. It is very useful for locating addresses, phone numbers, services and the date and location of annual meetings for obscure as well as established organizations. A keyword index makes it useful for identifying groups by subject.

Reference questions answered: When is the American Medical Association's annual meeting? What groups would have information about the bicycle as an alternative to automobiles?

Washington Information Directory  
*Congressional Quarterly*

Annual compilation of information sources in the federal government, including Congress and the private, non profit sector in Washington, D.C. Includes very helpful tables and information about the structure of other government agencies.

Conservation Directory  
*National Wildlife Federation*

This directory contains information about environmental organizations. It includes a listing of universities with environmental programs, sources for environmentally oriented audiovisual materials, national parks and wildlife refuges & Canadian citizen organizations & government agencies.

#### The World Almanac and Book of Facts

The world almanac is an easy to use source for quick factual information. It answers questions regarding important dates in history, demographic information on U.S. cities, and climactic data for various cities and regions. It is a quick way to review Environmental Quality Indexes, Hazardous Waste Sites and the list of Very Toxic Chemicals.

#### The State of the States

*Fund for Renewable Energy and the Environment*

Each annual issue of the State of the States selects a variety of environmental topics and compares each of the States in terms of program strength, effective models and provides a general profile of state environmental policies. It is a good source for statistics on state research programs, legislation and facilities.

### **REGULATION**

#### Federal Regulatory Guide

*Congressional Quarterly*

This book gives extensive profiles of 13 government agencies and less detailed descriptions of 90 regulatory organizations. It is very useful for its overviews of the regulatory process.

Answers the common questions "What is the history of EPA?" and "Where can I find a summary of major EPA legislation?".

#### Code of Federal Regulations

*(on compact disk)*

The Code of Federal Regulations and the Federal Register are available in the library in paper copy and microfilm. In addition, an electronic version of the CFR is available at the public microcomputer workstations. Electronic access is useful for locating obscure references in the CFR as well as analyzing vocabulary used in regulations.

### **LEGISLATION**

#### Codification of Presidential Proclamations and Executive Orders

*Office of the Federal Register*

This index to executive orders is arranged in 50 general subject areas, similar to the Code of Federal Regulations.

### Statistical Abstract of the United States *Bureau of the Census*

This is the standard summary of social, political and economic statistics for the United States.

### U.S. Industrial Outlook *Department of Commerce*

Overview of the current status and anticipated growth of most manufacturing and service industries. Each chapter contains a broad overview of the industry and forecasts for development.

## RESEARCH GUIDES AND BIBLIOGRAPHIES

The library produces several research guides and bibliographies as tools for more in depth research. These documents organize the current literature on major topics. Current bibliographies exist for waste minimization, risk assessment, management and communications, chemical emergency preparedness, asbestos and estuarine management to name a few. In addition, library pathfinders guide the researcher to the libraries special collections and to other resources within the agency. The "Pathfinder to Major EPA Dockets" and the "Pathfinder to the Microfiche Collection" are examples.

## MAJOR COMMERCIAL & EPA DATA BASES AVAILABLE

The following major commercial and EPA databases provide a wide range of information systems that the EPA Headquarters Library has access to. The librarian's function is that of a reference/broker role to provide research information for the EPA employees.

### COMMERCIAL DATABASES

**DIALOG INFORMATION RETRIEVAL SERVICE:** A commercial vendor of databases, has more than 200 databases available through its system. The type of information varies with the database accessed; database records may be listing or statistical tables. Some of the DIALOG databases commonly used by EPA libraries are pollution abstracts, Enviroline, Chemical Regulations and Guidelines, Social SciSearch, and the National Technical Information Service (NTIS).

Contents include:

- **ENVIROLINE:** Produced by the Environment Information Center, covers the world's environmental information. Its comprehensive, interdisciplinary approach provides indexing and abstracting coverage of more than 5,000 international primary and secondary source publications reporting on all aspects of the environment.
- **ENVIRONMENTAL BIBLIOGRAPHY:** Covers the fields of general human ecology, atmospheric studies, energy, land resources, water resources, and nutrition and health.
- **POLLUTION ABSTRACTS:** A leading resource for references to environmentally related literature on pollution, its sources, and its control. The subjects include: Air Pollution, Environmental Quality, Noise Pollution, Pesticides, Radiation, Solid Wastes, and Water Pollution.
- **CHEMICAL REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES SYSTEM:** An authoritative index to U.S. federal regulatory material relating to the control of chemical substances, covering federal statutes, promulgated regulations and available federal guidelines, standards, and support documents.
- **SCISEARCH:** A multidisciplinary index to the literature of science and technology. It contains all the records published in Science Citation Index (SCI) and additional records from the Current Contents series of publications that are not included in the printed version of SCI. SCISEARCH covers every area of the pure and applied sciences.
- **SOCIAL SCISEARCH:** A multidisciplinary database indexing every significant item from the 1,500 most important social sciences journals throughout the world and social sciences articles selected from 3,000 additional journals in the natural, physical, biomedical sciences and monographs.
- **NTIS:** Consists of government-sponsored research, development, and engineering plus analyses prepared by federal agencies, their contractors or grantees. Many topics of immediate broad interest are included, such as environmental pollution and control, energy conversion, technology transfer, behavioral/societal problems, urban and regional planning.
- **LEXIS:** A full-text database that includes information on federal law, with decisions of all Federal Courts and State Courts, the United States Code, and the Federal Register, as well as specialized law libraries in the following areas: taxation; securities; trade regulation; patent; trademark; and copyright; communications; labor; and bankruptcy.

Special files on population, cancer, and toxic substances are also available on the NLM database.

Contents include:

- **TOXLINE**: A product of the National Library of Medicine, contains citations and abstracts to the worldwide literature in all areas of toxicology, including chemicals and pharmaceuticals, pesticides, environmental pollutants, mutagens and teratology.
- **TOXNET**: A computerized system of toxicologically oriented data banks operated by the National Library of Medicine.
- **CHEMICAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (CIS)**: A commercially available collection of scientific and regulatory database. It contains numeric, textual, and some bibliographic information in the areas of toxicology, environment, regulations, spectroscopy, chemical and physical properties, and nucleotide sequences.
- **NATIONAL GROUND WATER INFORMATION CENTER DATABASE(GROUND WATER ON-LINE)**: A bibliographic database, contains references on the occurrence and utilization of surface and ground water, and on water well technology. Indexed titles include trade and technical journals and newsletters, books, and government documents. Because EPA established the Center, there is special emphasis in the database on EPA-sponsored reports.

### EPA DATABASES:

- **INTEGRATED RISK INFORMATION SYSTEM (IRIS)**: An E-Mail based system containing EPA data on a chemical by chemical basis. Data include, when available, oral reference doses, carcinogenicity assessments, acute health hazard data, and risk management summaries. Sources of data include ORD, OPTS, OW, OAR, OSWER, and OPPE.
- **HAZARDOUS WASTE DATABASE**: An EPA system, contains references to key materials on hazardous waste in the EPA library network. Bibliographic descriptions, keywords, abstracts, locations and other information are listed for books, EPA reports, Office of Solid Waste and Emergency Response (OSWER) policy and guidance directives, periodicals and commercial databases containing information on hazardous waste. Hard copies of the documents are available in the Headquarters and Regional libraries, the National Enforcement Investigations Center/Denver, CO, and the laboratory libraries in Cincinnati, OH; and Las Vegas, NV. A list of the documents is available at all other laboratory libraries.
