# PUBLISHING BY THE OFFICE OF SOLID WASTE IN FISCAL YEARS 1968 — 1977

This is the year-by-year listing of publications, films, and other informational materials produced by the Federal solid waste management program since 1967. The original legislation for the solid waste program, the Solid Waste Disposal Act of 1965, specifically directed the program to "make available, through publications and other appropriate means," research results and other information pertaining to solid waste management. The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 specifically directs the EPA to "implement a program for the rapid dissemination of information on solid waste management," including the results of relevant research, surveys, and studies.

This listing not only records what has been issued under the solid waste legislation but also reflects to some degree the development of the solid waste management field in general: the increasing awareness of potential recovery of resources from waste; growing concern about the range of environmental problems that result from poor waste management; increasing involvement of citizen and other interest groups; and, as a result of all this, the vast increase in the related literature as evidenced by the bibliographic reports.

Copies of many of the items published since 1972 are available without charge from the Office of Solid Waste (write to Solid Waste Information, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Cincinnati, Ohio 45268). Other reports, mainly those emanating from EPA contractors and grantees, may be purchased, as noted in the listing, from the National Technical Information Service, Springfield, Virginia 22161. Many of the publications of earlier years are out of print and available only within the Agency or from government, university, or public libraries; some of the out-of-print publications are available for reference in the Solid Waste Information Staff's "open file," as are unpublished reports from grantees and contractors.
