DEVELOPING AND REVIEWING CRITICAL REGULATIONS

REDUCING THE BACKLOG OF NEW SOURCE PERFORMANCE STANDARDS (NSPS)

- O ALTHOUGH ADDITIONAL STEPS WERE TAKEN DURING THE QUARTER TO IMPROVE ADHERENCE TO NSPS DEVELOPMENT SCHEDULES BY RAISING THEIR VISIBILITY WITHIN THE AGENCY, NONE OF THE PROJECTED PROPOSALS OR PROMULGATIONS WERE ACHIEVED.
- O THE MAJORITY OF THE LATE NSPS ARE BEING HELD AT OMB, SOME AS LONG AS SIX MONTHS BEYOND THE RELEASE DATE.
- O THREE NSPS ARE AWAITING SIGNATURE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR.
- O TWO PRIORITY CATEGORY NSPS PROPOSALS DUE IN THE FOURTH QUARTER ARE CURRENTLY ON SCHEDULE.

SPECIAL ACTION SIPS

PROGRESS ON 1982 OZONE/CO SIPs

- O OF 31 PLANS SUBMITTED, 21 ARE PROJECTED TO BE APPROVED AND 10 WILL BE DISAPPROVED.
- O SIX OF THE PROJECTED APPROVED PLANS WILL NOT BE APPROVED FOR I/M UNTIL THE PROGRAMS ACTUALLY BEGIN OPERATION.
- O ALL APPROVED ACTIONS ARE EXPECTED TO BE SUBMITTED TO HEADQUARTERS BY THE END OF THE FOURTH QUARTER.
- O ALL DISAPPROVED ACTIONS ARE DELAYED PENDING FINAL ACTION ON THE SANCTIONS POLICY:
 - BY THE END OF AUGUST, SANCTIONS POLICY WILL BE PUBLISHED IN FEDERAL REGISTER.
 - BY END OF SEPTEMBER, DETAILED GUIDANCE DOCUMENT TO ASSIST STATES TO CORRECT DEFICIENT PLANS WILL BE AVAILABLE.
- o FIRST SANCTIONS PROPOSED WILL BE FOR FAILURE TO IMPLEMENT I/M.


SPECIAL ACTION SIPS

PROGRESS ON LEAD SIPS

- O THE NRDC SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT WAS SENT TO THE ADMINISTRATOR FOR SIGNATURE IN EARLY JULY.
- O A WORKSHOP WAS HELD FOR REGIONAL OFFICES ON HOW TO IMPLEMENT THE SCHEDULE IN THE AGREEMENT. THE KEY DATES IN THE SCHEDULE FOR STATES WITH LEAD PROBLEMS ARE:
 - AUGUST 1, 1983: STATES SUBMIT SIPS TO EPA.
 - JANUARY 3, 1984: EPA PROPOSES APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL.
 - AUGUST 1, 1984: EPA GIVES FINAL APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL.
- O THE SCHEDULE FOR STATES WITHOUT LEAD PROBLEMS IS SIMILAR BUT DELAYED BY SIX MONTHS.
- O THE AGREEMENT REQUIRES THAT EPA MUST PROMULGATE FEDERAL LEAD PLANS IF STATES DO NOT SUBMIT SIPS IN TIME FOR EPA TO PROPOSE APPROVAL OR IF EPA DISAPPROVES A STATE LEAD PLAN.


PERCENT OF SIP REVISIONS PROCESSED ON TIME

- O A GROWING NUMBER OF SIP ACTIONS ARE EXCEEDING BOTH THE REGIONS AND HEADQUARTERS PROCESSING TARGETS:
 - IN THE REGIONS, 28 OF 320 PENDING ACTIONS EXCEED THE FIVE MONTH TARGET.
 - AT HEADQUARTERS, 26 OF 107 ACTIVE SIP'S EXCEED THE TWO MONTH TARGET.
- o ALTHOUGH THE NUMBER OF SIP ACTIONS IN PROCESS CONTINUES TO GROW, RESOURCES DEVOTED TO THE TASK HAVE REMAINED FIXED.
- O UNRESOLVED MAJOR POLICY ISSUES AT HEADQUARTERS, INCLUDING THE SANCTIONS POLICY, CONTINUE TO CAUSE DELAYS OF MANY PENDING SIP ACTIONS.
- o FOR THE 26 SIP ACTIONS BACKLOGGED AT HEADQUARTERS, THE FOLLOWING OFFICES ARE RESPONSIBLE JOINTLY OR INDIVIDUALLY FOR THE INDICATED NUMBER OF PENDING ACTIONS:
 - ADMINISTRATOR
 - AA FOR OANR 7
 - OAQPS 7 (3 ARE JOINT)
 - OGC 12 (3 ARE JOINT)
 - OSR 3 (3 ARE JOINT)



AIR ENFORCEMENT

- O THE OVERALL COMPLIANCE RATE FOR MAJOR SOURCES IS 95%. DURING THE THIRD QUARTER 143 NEW SOURCES WERE FOUND IN VIOLATION AND 179 SOURCES ACHIEVED FINAL EMISSION LIMITATIONS OR WERE PLACED ON ACCEPTABLE COMPLIANCE SCHEDULES.
- O THE NUMBER OF SIGNIFICANT VIOLATORS IS CONTINUING TO INCREASE:
 - SIGNIFICANT VIOLATORS INCREASED FROM 328 AT THE BEGINNING OF THE THIRD QUARTER TO 365 AT THE END OF THE QUARTER.
 - 82 NEW SIGNIFICANT VIOLATORS WERE IDENTIFIED.
 - 45 SIGNIFICANT VIOLATORS WERE RETURNED TO COMPLIANCE OR PLACED ON ACCEPTABLE COMPLIANCE SCHEDULES.
- o RATES FOR STATE COMPLIANCE INSPECTIONS IMPROVED SUBSTANTIALLY THIS QUARTER:
 - 75% OF Al SOURCES DUE INSPECTION HAVE BEEN INSPECTED.
 - 78% OF A2 SOURCES DUE INSPECTION HAVE BEEN INSPECTED.
- O CLOSER ATTENTION IS NEEDED FOR STATES IN REGIONS I, II, V, VII AND X WITH SIGNIFICANTLY LOW INSPECTION RATES.




DELEGATION TO STATES

NEW SOURCE PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

- O THE OVERALL DELEGATION OF NSPS DECLINED SLIGHTLY THIS QUARTER TO 89%, DUE TO THE ADDITION OF FOUR NEW NSPS TO THE LIST OF APPLICABLE STANDARDS.
- O MOST REGIONAL COMMITMENTS WERE MET DURING THE THIRD QUARTER:
 - REGION III DELEGATED THE FOUR NEW NSPS TO PHILADELPHIA THIS QUARTER, AHEAD OF THEIR PROJECTED SCHEDULE.
 - THE EIGHT NSPS SCHEDULED BY REGION II FOR DELEGATION TO PUERTO RICO ARE INCOMPLETE AWAITING FINAL FEDERAL REGISTER NOTICE.
 - REGION VII DELEGATED ONE NEW NSPS TO IOWA, BUT FAILED TO DELEGATE NSPS TO NEBRASKA, IOWA AND MISSOURI AS PLANNED. DELEGATION FOR THESE STATES IS NOW PROJECTED FOR THE FOURTH QUARTER OR EARLY FY 1984.

DELEGATION STATUS OF NSPS As Of June 30, 1983





DELEGATION TO STATES

NATIONAL EMISSION STANDARDS FOR HAZARDOUS AIR POLLUTANTS

- O NO NESHAPS DELEGATIONS WERE SCHEDULED FOR THE THIRD QUARTER AND NONE WERE ACHIEVED.
- O AT THE END OF THE THIRD QUARTER, DELEGATION REMAINS AT 94% OVERALL.
- O NESHAPS FOR FOUR BENZENE CATEGORIES ARE SCHEDULED FOR PROMULGATION DURING THE FOURTH QUARTER. HOWEVER, THESE STANDARDS WILL NOT BE DUE FOR DELEGATION BEFORE FY 84.


DELEGATION STATUS OF NESHAPS As Of June 30, 1983



DELEGATION TO STATES

PREVENTION OF SIGNIFICANT DETERIORATION

- O THE PROGRESS IN DELEGATING THE PSD PROGRAM HAS BEEN SLOWER THAN EXPECTED AND SEVERAL REGIONS HAVE HAD TO REVISE THEIR COMMITMENTS:
 - FULL DELEGATION WILL NOT BE DONE BEFORE FY 1984 IN MARICOPA AND WASHOE COUNTIES IN REGION IX AND KANSAS IN REGION VII.
 - COLORADO MAY NOT ACCEPT DELEGATION FROM REGION VIII THIS FISCAL YEAR.
- O FULL RESPONSIBILITY WAS DELEGATED ON SCHEDULE TO NEW JERSEY AND ALASKA.
- O DELEGATIONS TO ARIZONA AND NEVADA, ORIGINALLY PLANNED FOR THE SECOND QUARTER, WERE FINALIZED DURING THE THIRD QUARTER.


PESTICIDE REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS

CURRENT APPLICATIONS

- O OPP MET THE OVERALL TARGET IN THE THIRD QUARTER, REVIEWING AN AVERAGE OF 95% OF ALL APPLICATIONS WITHIN THE ADMINISTRATIVE SCHEDULES.
- O TIMELY PERFORMANCE DECREASED IN TWO CATEGORIES OF REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS IN THE THIRD QUARTER:
 - NEW CHEMICAL REVIEWS, FROM 97% to 89% WITHIN THE SCHEDULE; AND
 - OLD CHEMICALS, FROM 98% to 89%.

BACKLOG

- o WHILE THE ACTUAL THIRD QUARTER BACKLOG GREW TO 714 APPLICATIONS, 645 WERE DUE TO THE RECENT COURT RULING WHICH ELIMINATED THE MANDATORY CITE-ALL REQUIREMENT FOR REGISTRATION DATA COMPENSATION.
- O OPP HAS COMPLETED REVIEWS OF THESE APPLICATIONS, BUT HAS DELAYED THEIR APPROVAL PENDING REGISTRANTS' RESPONSE TO INTERIM PROCEDURES THAT WERE ISSUED AS A RESULT OF LITIGATION.
- O THE 69 OTHER APPLICATIONS REMAINING IN THE BACKLOG REPRESENT NO PROGRESS IN REDUCING THE BACKLOG SINCE THE SECOND QUARTER.




PESTICIDE FFDCA TOLERANCE PETITIONS

CURRENT PETITIONS

- O OPP REVIEWED 79% OF THE PETITIONS WITHIN THE STATUTORY DEADLINE, DOWN FROM 81% LAST QUARTER.
- O OVERALL, QUARTERLY PERFORMANCE DECREASED GIVEN 46% FEWER PETITIONS WERE DUE FOR COMPLETION THAN IN THE SECOND QUARTER.

BACKLOG

O THE BACKLOG OF UNPROCESSED PETITIONS HAS MORE THAN DOUBLED, UP FROM 28 TO 58 APPLICATIONS, SINCE THE BEGINNING OF FY 83. THE BACKLOG IS BEGINNING TO BECOME SIGNIFICANT IN THAT IT IS APPROACHING THE FY 82 LEVEL.




PESTICIDE EXPERIMENTAL USE PERMITS

CURRENT APPLICATIONS

O OPP PROCESSED 92% OF THE APPLICATIONS WITHIN THE ADMINISTRATIVE SCHEDULE. THIS REPRESENTS CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT IN PROCESSING AS THE NUMBER OF SUBMISSIONS HAS INCREASED IN EACH QUARTER OF FY 83.

BACKLOG

- O THE BACKLOG INCREASED TO 20 APPLICATIONS IN THE THIRD QUARTER.
- O THERE HAS BEEN A FOUR-FOLD INCREASE IN THE BACKLOG SINCE THE BEGINNING OF FY 83. THE BACKLOG IS BECOMING A SIGNIFICANT PROBLEM IN THAT IT IS APPROACHING THE FY 82 LEVEL.




PESTICIDE REGISTRATION STANDARDS

- O OPP ESTABLISHED EIGHT REGISTRATION STANDARDS IN THE THIRD QUARTER.

 THIS PERFORMANCE EXCEEDED THE TARGET AND RAISED TO SIXTEEN THE TOTAL NUMBER OF STANDARDS ESTABLISHED IN FY 83.
- O OPP MANAGEMENT HAS YET TO RESPOND TO RECOMMENDATIONS MADE IN A SECOND QUARTER OMSE MANAGEMENT REVIEW OF THE REGISTRATION STANDARDS PROGRAM. THE MANAGEMENT REVIEW IDENTIFIED (AND OPP CONCURRED IN) A NEED FOR OPP TO FOCUS ON OBTAINING AND PROCESSING DATA REQUESTED OF REGISTRANTS.

PESTICIDE REGISTRATION STANDARDS CUMULATIVE NUMBER OF STANDARDS ESTABLISHED As Of June 30, 1983



PESTICIDE SPECIAL REVIEW DECISIONS

- OPTS COMPLETED THE FIRST FOUR SPECIAL REVIEWS OF FY 83 IN THE THIRD QUARTER:
 - TWO CHEMICALS WERE RETURNED TO THE REGISTRATION PROCESS;
 - ONE PROPOSED DECISION WAS ISSUED TO CANCEL SOME USES AND RESTRICT OTHER USES OF COMPOUND 1080; AND
 - ONE FINAL RESOLUTION WAS ANNOUNCED TO RESTRICT USES OF EPN.
- O OPTS' REQUEST FOR A CHANGE IN THE SPECIAL REVIEW COMMITMENT FROM THIRTEEN TO EIGHT COMPLETIONS IN FY 83 HAS BEEN APPROVED. THIS CHANGE IS REFLECTED IN THE FOURTH QUARTER TARGET.



INTERAGENCY TESTING COMMITTEE (ITC) DESIGNATIONS -- PAST LIST

- O OPTS ACHIEVED THE THIRD QUARTER TARGET.
- o THIRTEEN PRELIMINARY DECISIONS WERE MADE:
 - ONE NEGOTIATED TESTING AGREEMENT WAS PROPOSED;
 - EIGHT TEST RULES WERE INITIATED;
 - TWO ANPRS FOR REGULATORY ACTION WERE INITIATED; AND
 - TWO CHEMICALS WILL NOT REQUIRE TESTING.
- O COMPLETION OF THIS LIST, SCHEDULED FOR THIS CALENDAR YEAR, WILL ELIMINATE THE ITC BACKLOG.

INTERAGENCY TESTING COMMITTEE (ITC) DESIGNATIONS -- NEW LISTS

- O OPTS ACHIEVED THE THIRD QUARTER TARGET.
- o FOUR DECISION PACKAGES WERE APPROVED BY THE ADMINISTRATOR AND WERE PROPOSED IN THE FEDERAL REGISTER ONE WEEK AHEAD OF SCHEDULE:
 - ONE NEGOTIATED TESTING AGREEMENT WAS PROPOSED; AND
 - THREE TEST RULES WERE PROPOSED.
- O THE COURT ORDER HAS NOW BEEN MET FOR THE TENTH LIST. THE PROPOSED DECISIONS MUST BE FINALIZED AFTER PUBLIC COMMENT HAS BEEN OBTAINED.




FIFRA COMPLIANCE MONITORING -- FEDERAL INSPECTIONS

- O THE END-OF-YEAR TARGETS HAVE NOW BEEN EXCEEDED FOR ALL CATEGORIES EXCEPT USE INSPECTIONS AND LABORATORY AUDITS. INSPECTIONS COMPLETED IN THE THIRD QUARTER RAISED THE TOTAL NUMBER OF INSPECTIONS COMPLETED IN FY 83 TO 821.
- O THIS QUARTER ADMINISTRATIVE CIVIL COMPLAINTS WERE ISSUED AGAINST 145 SIGNIFICANT VIOLATORS. OF 222 SIGNIFICANT CASES IN FY 83, 156 CASES REMAIN OPEN. AN ADDITIONAL 117 CASES FROM FY 80-82 REMAIN OPEN.
- O APPROXIMATELY 75 SIGNIFICANT VIOLATIONS RESULTED FROM FAILURE TO REPORT PRODUCTION DATA RATHER THAN FROM INSPECTIONS.






REGIONAL TSCA COMPLIANCE MONITORING INSPECTIONS

- O REGIONAL PROGRESS WAS ONCE AGAIN INCONSISTENT NATIONALLY:
 - REGION X HAS NEARLY ACHIEVED ITS END OF YEAR TARGET.
 - REGIONS I, III, VI, VII AND IX ARE GENERALLY ON SCHEDULE.
 - REGION V CONTINUED TO MAKE SLOW PROGRESS ON INSPECTIONS, BUT IS DETECTING A HIGH LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANT VIOLATORS (93 IN 249 INSPECTIONS). THIS PERFORMANCE ACCOUNTS FOR 47% OF THE NATIONAL TOTAL.
 - REGION II REPEATED ITS POOR SECOND QUARTER PERFORMANCE. THIRTY-SIX INSPECTIONS WERE PERFORMED IN THE THIRD QUARTER FOR A TOTAL OF 59 INSPECTIONS COMPLETED TO DATE. THIS FALLS FAR SHORT OF THE END-OF-YEAR TARGET OF 303.
 - REGION VIII HAS NOW EXCEEDED THE END-OF-YEAR TARGET BY 225
 INSPECTIONS. THE LOW VIOLATION RATE IN REGION VIII WAS THE
 SUBJECT OF AN OMSE MANAGEMENT REVIEW DURING THE THIRD QUARTER.
 THE REGION HAS BEGUN TO IMPLEMENT CHANGES TO IMPROVE INSPECTION
 TARGETING.



TSCA COMPLIANCE MONITORING INSPECTIONS

- THE REGIONS HAVE COLLECTIVELY COMPLETED 71% OF THE END-OF-YEAR TARGET. WHILE IT APPEARS THAT THE REGIONS ARE ON SCHEDULE, THEY HAVE ACTUALLY COMPLETED 59% OF THE TARGET IF THE OVERAGE OF 225 INSPECTIONS COMPLETED IN EXCESS OF THE TARGET IN REGION VIII IS DISCOUNTED.
- O OF 1380 INSPECTIONS COMPLETED TO DATE IN FY 83, 1183, OR 86% WERE FOR PCB COMPLIANCE MONITORING. EFFORTS IN THE FOURTH QUARTER WILL BE DIRECTED TO COMPLETING INSPECTIONS FOR ASBESTOS, REPORTING AND PREMANUFACTURE NOTIFICATION RULES.
- O CIVIL COMPLAINTS WERE INITIATED AGAINST 65 SIGNIFICANT VIOLATORS
 IN THE THIRD QUARTER. THE CUMULATIVE NUMBER OF FY 83 SIGNIFICANT
 CASES IS 193. SIXTY-FIVE CASES HAVE BEEN CLOSED.



STATE UNDERGROUND INJECTION CONTROL PROGRAMS APPROVED

- O PROGRESS CONTINUES TO BE SLOW IN DELEGATING PROGRAMS TO THE STATES.
- O DURING THE THIRD QUARTER, GUAM ASUMED FULL PRIMACY AND CALIFORNIA RECEIVED PARTIAL PROGRAM APPROVAL. ARIZONA WAS ADDED TO THE LIST OF STATES REQUIRING A FEDERAL PROGRAM.
- O REGION VI SUBMITTED THE ARKANSAS APPLICATION FOR CLASS II PRIMACY ON SCHEDULE.
- O TEN OF THE 23 STATES CURRENTLY TARGETED FOR FULL PRIMACY IN FY 83 PROBABLY WILL NOT RECEIVE PRIMACY UNTIL FY 84.
- O REGIONS MISSED THEIR TARGETS FOR SUBMISSION OF NINE STATE APPLICATIONS:
 - FOUR HAD MINOR STATE DELAYS AND ARE EXPECTED DURING 4TH QUARTER.
 - FOUR, DUE TO CHANGING STATE PRIORITIES, ARE NOT EXPECTED UNTIL FY 84.

- O AT THE END OF THE THIRD QUARTER, STATE UIC PROGRAMS COVERED ABOUT 53% OF THE JUNE 1983 NATIONAL INVENTORY OF INJECTION WELLS. THEY WERE TARGETED TO COVER ABOUT 83% BY THE END OF THE YEAR BUT ARE NOW EXPECTED TO COVER ABOUT 58%.






NPDES PERMITTING

REPERMITTING

- AT THE START OF FY 83, EPA'S NPDES REPERMITTING BACKLOG INCLUDED APPROXIMATELY 1,175 MAJOR PERMITS AND 9,000 MINOR PERMITS. OF THE 1,175 BACKLOGGED MAJOR PERMITS, 20 WERE FOR FEDERAL FACILITIES, 260 WERE FOR MUNICIPALITIES AND 895 WERE FOR INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES. THE OFFICE OF WATER IS CURRENTLY GIVING PRIORITY TO REDUCING THE BACKLOG OF MAJOR INDUSTRIAL PERMITS.
- O NPDES REPERMITTING PROGRESS IS SLOW. IT WILL TAKE A CONCERTED EFFORT TO MEET THE FOURTH QUARTER TARGET.
- O WHILE, NATIONALLY, THE OFFICE OF WATER HAS ISSUED 106 OF THE 112 PERMITS TARGETED FOR THE FIRST THREE QUARTERS, ONLY 43 OF THE 62 PERMITS TARGETED FOR THE THIRD QUARTER WERE ISSUED.







- O ALL REGIONS AND STATES, EXCEPT REGION III AND ITS STATES, ARE VOLUNTARILY USING THE NEW DEFINITION OF SIGNIFICANT NON-COMPLIANCE IN REPORTING COMPLIANCE.
- O THE STATE OF VIRGINIA DID NOT REPORT IN TIME TO BE INCLUDED IN THIS REPORT.







- O NATIONALLY, THE THIRD QUARTER COMPLIANCE RATE FOR MAJOR NON-MUNICIPALS ON FINAL EFFLUENT LIMITS WAS 91%. REGIONS III, VIII AND X ARE SIGNIFICANTLY BEHIND THEIR END-OF-YEAR TARGETS.
- O DURING THE FIRST THREE QUARTERS, EPA MADE 443 COMPLIANCE INSPECTIONS OF MAJOR NON-MUNICIPAL FACILITIES TO CONFIRM COMPLIANCE REPORTING.



POPULATION SERVED BY WATER SYSTEMS IN PERSISTENT VIOLATION






- O PROGRESS IN AWARDING PHASE I AUTHORIZATIONS HAS BEEN EXCELLENT.

 NEVADA AND OHIO OBTAINED PHASE I AUTHORIZATION IN JULY 1983, BRINGING

 THE TOTAL TO 38. THIRTY-NINE STATES ARE TARGETED FOR AUTHORIZATION

 BY THE END OF FY 83.
- O WASHINGTON SUBMITTED ITS FINAL APPLICATION ON TARGET AND IS SCHEDULED TO OBTAIN AUTHORIZATION DURING FOURTH QUARTER. THE STATE OF MISSOURI NOW ANTICIPATES OBTAINING PHASE I AUTHORIZATION IN FIRST QUARTER FY 84, RATHER THAN FOURTH QUARTER FY 83.
- O SIX STATES PLAN TO GO DIRECTLY TO FINAL AUTHORIZATION -- VIRGIN ISLANDS, MICHIGAN, MINNESOTA, COLORADO, SOUTH DAKOTA AND IDAHO. TWO STATES DO NOT INTEND TO ADOPT THE RCRA PROGRAM -- WYOMING AND HAWAII.
- O PHASE I IS AUTHORIZED TO STATES THAT HAVE AN ACCEPTABLE FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERTAKING ALL RCRA RESPONSIBILITIES, EXCEPT PERMITTING.





RCRA-C PHASE II STATE AUTHORIZATIONS

- O PROGRESS IN AWARDING PHASE II AUTHORIZATIONS GENERALLY HAS BEEN ON TARGET. PHASE II IS AUTHORIZED TO STATES THAT HAVE AN ACCEPTABLE PROGRAM FOR PERMITTING HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITIES.
- O CONNECTICUT AND NEVADA OBTAINED PHASE II AUTHORIZATION, BRINGING THE TOTAL TO 12. TWENTY-THREE STATES ARE TARGETED FOR PHASE II BY THE END OF FY 83.
- O MISSISSIPPI, OKLAHOMA AND CONNECTICUT HAVE PERMITTING AUTHORITY FOR ALL PHASE II COMPONENTS, I.E., STORAGE AND TREATMENT, INCINERATION AND LAND DISPOSAL. CALIFORNIA HAS PERMITTING AUTHORITY FOR STORAGE AND TREATMENT. THE REMAINING EIGHT STATES HAVE PERMITTING AUTHORITY FOR STORAGE AND TREATMENT AND INCINERATION.
- O DURING THE THIRD QUARTER, MAINE AND WASHINGTON SUBMITTED THEIR FINAL APPLICATIONS, AND RHODE ISLAND AND NEW JERSEY SUBMITTED THEIR DRAFT APPLICATIONS AS SCHEDULED.
- O ALABAMA'S FINAL APPLICATION IS BEHIND SCHEDULE PENDING A STATE STATUTORY CHANGE. IN ADDITION, EPA'S DECISION TO GRANT INTERIM AUTHORIZATION TO FLORIDA HAS BEEN POSTPONED UNTIL FOURTH QUARTER DUE TO A NEEDED STATUTORY CHANGE ON PERMIT BY DEFAULT.
- O FIFTEEN STATES PLAN TO GO DIRECTLY TO FINAL AUTHORIZATION, INCLUDING ALL STATES IN REGION V, PUERTO RICO, VIRGIN ISLANDS, DELAWARE, IOWA, KANSAS, COLORADO, MONTANA, SOUTH DAKOTA AND IDAHO.

- O THE NUMBER OF RCRA PERMITS ISSUED HAS NEARLY DOUBLED SINCE SECOND QUARTER. NINE PERMITS WERE ISSUED, BRINGING THE TOTAL TO 19.
 REGION VI HAS ISSUED FOUR PERMITS, FOLLOWED BY REGIONS IV, VII AND IX WITH 3 EACH.
- o EXISTING FACILITIES (ACTIVITY SINCE INCEPTION OF PROGRAM IN FY 83):
 - EPA HAS CALLED IN 688 STORAGE AND TREATMENT APPLICATIONS. IN ADDITION, THE STATES HAVE CALLED IN 762 APPLICATIONS, FOR A TOTAL OF 1449. (FY 83 TARGET IS 686.) OF THE PERMITS CALLED IN, THE STATES AND EPA HAVE RECEIVED 507 APPLICATIONS. FIVE PERMITS WERE ISSUED DURING THIRD QUARTER, BRINGING THE TOTAL TO 7 (2 BY EPA AND 5 BY STATES).
 - EPA HAS CALLED IN 94 INCINERATION APPLICATIONS. IN ADDITION, THE STATES HAVE CALLED IN 36 FOR A TOTAL OF 133. (FY 83 TARGET IS 164.) OF THE PERMITS CALLED IN, THE STATES AND EPA ARE IN THE PROCESS OF REVIEWING 61 APPLICATIONS. NO PERMITS HAVE BEEN ISSUED YET.
 - EPA HAS CALLED IN 224 LAND DISPOSAL APPLICATIONS. IN ADDITION, THE STATES HAVE CALLED IN 11 FOR A TOTAL OF 235. (FY 83 TARGET IS 240.) OF THE PERMITS CALLED IN, THE STATES AND EPA HAVE RECEIVED 61 APPLICATIONS. NO PERMITS HAVE BEEN ISSUED YET.



SUPERFUND REMOVAL ACTIVITIES

- O OSWER SIGNIFICANTLY EXPANDED REMOVAL EFFORTS. FORTY-EIGHT IMMEDIATE REMOVAL ACTIONS WERE INITIATED THIS QUARTER, COMPARED WITH A TOTAL OF 28 FOR THE FIRST TWO QUARTERS. TWENTY-THREE ACTIONS WERE COMPLETED FOR AN FY 83 TOTAL OF 57.
- o \$4.6 MILLION WAS OBLIGATED DURING THIRD QUARTER, COMPARED WITH \$3.6 MILLION FOR THE FIRST TWO QUARTERS. THE FY 83 TOTAL TO DATE IS \$7.2 MILLION.
- o FOUR PLANNED REMOVAL ACTIVITIES WERE INITIATED, BRINGING THE FY 83 TOTAL TO 7. NO ADDITIONAL PLANNED REMOVALS WERE COMPLETED, WITH THE FY 83 TOTAL REMAINING AT 5.
- O EPA ALSO UNDERTOOK 142 OTHER ON-SCENE RESPONSE ACTIVITIES.




MEETING PROGRAM COMMITMENTS

SUPERFUND REMEDIAL ACTIVITIES

- O THE INITIATION OF REMEDIAL INVESTIGATIONS/FEASBILITY STUDIES (RI/FS) IS PROCEEDING IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NEW SUPERFUND STRATEGY. PROGRESS IN ENGINEERING DESIGNS AND REMEDIAL IMPLEMENTATION ACTIONS HAS SLOWED AND TARGETS ARE BEING REVISED DOWNWARD DUE TO A CHANGE IN OBLIGATION AUTHORITY (SEE BELOW). DURING THIRD QUARTER, \$16.7 MILLION WAS OBLIGATED FOR REMEDIAL ACTIVITIES. THIS BRINGS THE CUMULATIVE AMOUNT OF FY 83 REMEDIAL FUNDS OBLIGATED TO \$35 MILLION. OF THE \$16.7 MILLION:
 - \$7.0 MILLION WAS OBLIGATED FOR (RI/FS) AT 12 NEW SITES, BRINGING THE FY 83 TOTAL TO 26. THIS IS ONLY 2 SHORT OF THE THIRD QUARTER TARGET WHICH CALLED FOR RI/FS AT 28 SITES.
 - \$.2 MILLION WAS OBLIGATED FOR ENGINEERING DESIGNS.
 HOWEVER, CUMULATIVE PROJECT STARTS REMAIN AT 3 FOR
 FY 83. THE THIRD QUARTER TARGET CALLED FOR ENGINEERING
 DESIGNS AT 14 SITES.
 - \$1.4 MILLION WAS OBLIGATED FOR 2 INITIAL REMEDIAL MEASURES. \$8 MILLION WAS OBLIGATED FOR SITE ASSESSMENTS, INSPECTIONS AND DEVELOPMENT OF REMEDIAL ACTION MASTER PLANS.
- O NO FUNDS HAVE BEEN OBLIGATED IN FY 83 FOR REMEDIAL IMPLEMENTATION ACTIONS. FIRST AND SECOND QUARTER REPORTS OF FY 83 REMEDIAL ACTIONS AT TWO NEW SITES WERE IN ERROR. THE THIRD QUARTER TARGET CALLED FOR IMPLEMENTATION/CONSTRUCTION AT 7 NEW SITES.
 - O THE FY 83 OBLIGATION TARGETS FOR REMEDIAL ACTIVITIES HAS BEEN REDUCED FROM \$110 MILLION TO \$80 MILLION DUE TO REPROGRAMMING OF FUNDS TO CLEAN UP TIMES BEACH. THE PROGRAM WILL PROPOSE CHANGES IN FY 83 REMEDIAL TARGETS BASED ON THIS REDUCED OBLIGATION AUTHORITY.
 - O SINCE THE INCEPTION OF THE PROGRAM, 5 SITES ON THE NATIONAL PRIORITIES LIST (NPL) HAVE BEEN CLEANED UP. IN ADDITION, BY THE END OF THE THIRD QUARTER, REMEDIAL WORK WAS UNDERWAY AT 82 SITES.




SUPERFUND ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

- O SUPERFUND ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS ARE INCREASING. SEVENTEEN ADMINISTRATIVE ORDERS WERE ISSUED DURING THIRD QUARTER, BRINGING THE FY 83 TOTAL TO 131. FIVE OF THE ORDERS WERE ISSUED ON CONSENT AND 12 WERE ISSUED UNILATERALLY.
- O DURING THIRD QUARTER, 417 NOTICE LETTERS WERE ISSUED, BRINGING THE FY 83 TOTAL TO 1185 NOTICE LETTERS FOR 45 SITES.
- O NEGOTIATIONS ARE UNDERWAY WITH RESPONSIBLE PARTIES AT 87 SITES.

 NEGOTIATIONS AT 6 SITES HAVE BEEN CONCLUDED THIS FISCAL YEAR.
- O EPA OBTAINED PRIVATE PARTY CLEANUPS WORTH APPROXIMATELY \$6 MILLION AT 5 SITES. THIS BRINGS THE FY 83 TOTAL TO CLEANUPS WORTH \$68 MILLION AT 11 SITES.
- THERE WERE NO COST RECOVERY ACTIONS NEGOTIATED DURING THIRD QUARTER.

 THE FY 83 COST RECOVERY TOTAL REMAINS AT \$14.3 MILLION AT 3 SITES.



 - 4130 INSPECTIONS WERE CONDUCTED. 1085 OF THOSE WERE IN REGION III STATES.
 - 1716 HANDLERS WERE DETECTED WITH RCRA VIOLATIONS, 700 OF THESE WERE DETECTED IN REGION IV. REGION III AND VI ALSO RECORDED A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF VIOLATIONS.
 - 130 FORMAL ADMINISTRATIVE ORDERS REQUIRING COMPLIANCE WERE ISSUED. THE STATES IN REGIONS I AND IV ISSUED 29 EACH.






PROCESSING OF LITIGATION ACTIONS

- O DURING THE THIRD QUARTER, 27 NEW CIVIL ACTIONS WERE REFERRED TO EPA HEADQUARTERS, BRINGING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF NEW REFERRALS FOR THE YEAR TO 88, WHICH EQUALS APPROXIMATELY THE NUMBER REFERRED IN THE FIRST THREE QUARTERS OF FY 82.
- O HOWEVER, THE CIVIL REFERRAL RATE HAS DECLINED OVER THE LAST THREE QUARTERS; CONSEQUENTLY, AT THE PRESENT RATE, THE TOTAL NUMBER OF FY 83 NEW REFERRALS WILL BE SIGNIFICANTLY LOWER THAN THE TOTAL NUMBER OF FY 82 NEW REFERRALS.
- THIRTY-FOUR NEW CIVIL ACTIONS WERE REFERRED FROM EPA HEADQUARTERS
 TO DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FOR A TOTAL THIS YEAR OF 106 ACTIONS,
 EXCEEDING THE TOTAL FY 82 REFERRALS TO DOJ.
- O DURING THE THIRD QUARTER, 9 NEW CRIMINAL ACTIONS WERE REFERRED TO EPA HEADQUARTERS AND 6 OF THESE ACTIONS WERE REFERRED TO DOJ.



STATUS OF CIVIL REFERRALS

- O EPA HEADQUARTERS IS PROCESSING CIVIL ACTIONS IN A TIMELY MATTER;
 MOST CASES ARE PENDING AT DOJ, U.S. ATTORNEYS, OR DISTRICT COURTS.
- O DURING THIS QUARTER, THE AVERAGE PROCESSING TIME BY EPA HEADQUARTERS FOR CIVIL ACTIONS REFERRED TO DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE WAS 68 DAYS EXCEEDING ENFORCEMENT COUNSEL'S TARGET OF 90 DAYS.
- o 302 CIVIL ACTIONS WERE PENDING AT THE END OF THE THIRD QUARTER:
 - 55 PERCENT HAVE BEEN FILED IN DISTRICT COURTS.
 - 35 PERCENT HAVE BEEN REFERRED TO DOJ/U.S. ATTORNEYS.
 - 10 PERCENT ARE PENDING REVIEW AT EPA HEADQUARTERS.
- O 108 CIVIL CASES WERE CLOSED DURING THE FIRST THREE QUARTERS OF FY 83. A LITTLE OVER ONE-THIRD OF THESE CASES WERE CLOSED BY DISMISSAL OR WITHDRAWAL.
 - 59 BY SETTLEMENT.
 - 2 BY COURT JUDGMENT.
 - 5 BY COURT DISMISSAL.
 - 8 WITHDRAWN BY REGION.
 - 34 DECLINED BY EPA HEADQUARTERS, DOJ OR U.S. ATTORNEY.

- o DURING THE THIRD QUARTER, 688 PROJECTS/ACTIONS WERE IDENTIFIED FOR \$309 REVIEW. REVIEWS WERE COMPLETED FOR 486 PROJECTS/ACTIONS AND 96.0 PERCENT WERE REVIEWED ON TIME.
- o REGIONS I, II, III, IV, V AND VI COMPLETED 100 PERCENT OF THEIR \$309 REVIEWS ON TIME. HEADQUARTERS AND REGION VIII LAGGED BEHIND THE OTHER REGIONS WITH 81.8 AND 67.0 PERCENT OF THEIR REVIEWS COMPLETED ON TIME.
- THE INSPECTOR GENERAL AUDIT OF APRIL 22, 1983 IDENTIFIED 22 REVIEWS THAT WERE NOT PROPERLY CLOSED OUT; EPA IN MOST CASES DID NOT SEND A COMMENT LETTER. BY THE END OF THIRD QUARTER, 15 OF THESE PROBLEM REVIEWS HAD BEEN RESOLVED AND THE REMAINING 7 ARE IN THE PROCESS OF BEING COMPLETED.
