## BRIEF SYNOPSIS

---

In recent years, a great deal of public attention has been drawn to discoveries that certain chemicals in the environment can cause reproductive and other endocrine abnormalities in humans and wildlife species. The goal of this workshop is to provide risk managers and other environmental stakeholders with an introduction to what is known about the challenge of endocrine disrupting chemicals (EDC's) to human and ecosystem health, and to present the state-of-the-art in managing the risk associated with these chemicals.

Presentations will discuss known or suspected EDC's such as aldyphenols, DDT and DDE, natural and pharmaceutical hormones, bisphenol A, PCB's, chlorinated dioxins and dibenzofurans, phthalates, and the pesticides methoxychlor, endosulfan and atrazine. These chemicals have been detected in some sewage treatment plants, drinking water treatment plants, combustion processes, sediments, soils, concentrated animal feed,
