Advantages and Disadvantages of Environmental Auditing

- I. Traditional Advantages of Environmental Auditing
  - A. Better Compliance
  - B. Fewer Surprises (better to know compliance status now than when it's too late).
    - 1. Chemical Waste Management \$900 million loss in stock price following closure of landfill.
    - Union Carbide \$700 million loss in stock price following Bhopal.
    - 3. Rollins \$70 million loss in stock price following closure of incinerator.
  - C. Fewer penalties and suits.
    - 1. federal or state enforcement
    - 2. private citizen enforcement
    - 3. private damage suits
  - D. Better public image with the local community and regulators.
    - l. better chance of getting what you want in zoning or building permits.
    - 2. more likely to obtain financial breaks from your state or local government
    - fare better with community notification requirements under SARA.
    - 4. bounty of \$10,000 for criminal prosecutions under SARA.
  - E. Potential Cost Savings.
  - F. Increased Information Transfer.
  - G. Manage Regulatory Overload (259 sets of EPA Regs just under review, development or revision).

    - b. organization & staffing changes allow a corporation to better track wastes, prepare permit applications, communicate environmental policies programs and objectives to the facilities.
    - c. staff management and training not only achieved better compliance but greater awareness of regulatory requirements. Also helps bolster role of corporate headquarters env. management.
    - d. env. planning improved ability to anticipate and implement future env. requirements and respond quickly to env. hazards.
