Rapid Assessment for TA needs, project approach, and funding strategy


Procurement & Technical Assistance Approval using BECC's Expedited Contracting

Environmental Assessment & Financial Feasibility studies and alternatives analyzed considering cost, impact and sustainability


Final Design quality control is applied, value engineering (if necessary)

Status of Certified Projects

As of December 31, 2004, BECC has *certified 105 environmental infrastructure projects* which will cost an estimated US \$2.41 billion to build.







Accomplishments

The BECC has assisted in the development of 228 environmental infrastructure projects related to water, sewage, and municipal waste in 131 communities on both sides of the U.S.- Mexico border.

Sixty-nine (69) of the 105 certified projects are located in the United States; 36 are located in Mexico.
