THIS ARTICLE SUMMAPIZES DATA ON AIP POLLUTION IN VIENNA, RELEASED BY THE AUSTRIAN MINISTRY FOR HEALTH AND ENVIPONMENTAL PROTECTION. THE MINISTRY ATTRIBUTES THE POLLUTION CHIEFLY TO AUTOMOTIVE AND HOUSEHOLD EXHAUSTS. THE REPORT SHOWS THAT THERE WAS A 50 PERCENT AVERAGE DECLINE IN CARBON MONOXIDE IN THE AIR IN THE CITY CENTER AFTER THE PROCLAMATION OF A PEDESTRIAN-ONLY ZONE IN DOWNTOWN VIENNA. TO COMBAT AUTOMOTIVE POLLUTION, THE MINISTRY RECOMMENDS THE PROMOTION OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION, STRICTER AUTOMOBILE EMISSION STANDARDS FOR NEWLY-LICENSED VEHICLES AND MORE RIGOROUS CHECKS ON THOSE ALPEÂDY ON THE ROAD, AND STAGGERED WORK HOURS. TO REDUCE AIR POLLUTANTS FROM HOUSEHCLD HEATING, THE MINISTRY ARGUES FOR THE USE OF ELECTRICITY, GAS AND REMOTE-SOURCE HEATING. THE ACCOMPANYING GRAFHS SHOW MEASUREMENT PESULTS FOR A 24-HOUR PERIOD BY LOCATION AND BY POLLUTANT. A PROTECTIVE SPEEN AREA REGISTERED THE LEAST AMOUNT OF CARBON MONOXIDE. THE MEASUREMENTS WERE TAKEN IN 1971 AND 1972.

CONDITIONS WHICH MUST BE MET RELATE TO: THE POSSESSION OF APPROPRIATE PREMISES, EQUIPMENT AND INSTRUMENTATION; THE AVAILABILITY OF THE APPROPRIATE TECHNICAL STAFF; THE QUALIFICATIONS OF THE DIPECTOP; AND THE WILLINGNESS OF LABORATORY OFFICIALS TO PERMIT INSPECTION OF FACILITIES AND TO SUBMIT PEPORTS ON RESEARCH TECHNIQUES AS WELL AS ON LABORATORY MANAGEMENT AND EXPENDITURES. FURTHERMORE, THE DIRECTOP AND CERTAIN PERSONNEL OF SUCH LABORATORIES MAY NOT BE EITHER DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY ASSOCIATED WITH FIRMS WHICH PRODUCE POLLUTION CREATING OR POLLUTION COMBATTING DEVICES. CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH APPROVAL MAY BE WITHDRAWN ARE ALSO STATED.
