THIS REPORT OF THE AD HOC GROUP ON AIR POLLUTION OF THE ORGANIZATION FOR ECONOMIC COOPERATION AND DEVELOPMENT INCORPORATES NATIONAL REPORTS FROM 17 NATIONS AND INCLUDES A SUMMARY OF THE MAIN CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE GROUP. THIS REPORT, PREPARED BY A JOINT GROUP COMPRISED OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE ENERGY AND OIL COMMITTEES OF THE OECD AND THE AIR MANAGEMENT SECTOR GROUP OF THE OECD ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE, REPRESENTS A FIRST ANALYSIS BY 18 OECD COUNTRIES OF THE POSSIBLE AIR POLLUTION SITUATION WHICH COULD ARISE FROM THE PROJECTED USE OF FUELS IN STATIONARY SOURCES DURING THE PERIOD 1968-1980. THE INITIAL SECTION PRESENTS THE MAIN CONCLUSIONS OF THE STUDY AND APPRAISES THE SITUATION WHICH IT DISCLOSES. THE BULK OF THE REPORT IS A CONSOLIDATION OF REPORTS ON THE SITUATION IN INDIVIDUAL MEMBER STATES. IN 1972 THE EC COUNCIL OF MINISTERS (REPRESENTING NATIONAL INTERESTS) WAS CALLED UPON TO TAKE ACTION TO DRAFT AN ANTI-POLLUTION RESOLUTION, TO FORMULATE EMERGENCY ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY MEASURES, AND TO DRAFT A RESOLUTION TO THE SIGNATORIES OF THE BERNE CONVENTION ON PREVENTION OF POLLUTION OF THE RHINE. THE EC COMMISSION (REPRESENTING THE COMMUNITIES AS A WHOLE) IS SEEKING, THE AUTHOR STATES, TO ELABORATE A SYSTEM FOR ASSESSING ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS AND A PROGRAM OF ACTION AND CONTROLS.

FOR THE FORMULATION OF A MATHEMATICAL RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN CHANGES IN RIVER WATER QUALITY AND CHANGES IN HUMAN ACTIVITIES RESPONSIBLE FOR IT. THE P.P.I. DEPENDS ON POPULATION SIZE IN THE RIVER DRAINAGE AREA, THE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN THE RIVER BASIN, AND THE AVERAGE WATERFLOW OF THE RIVER. THE RELATION OF THE P.P.I.
