IN 1972 THE EC COUNCIL OF MINISTERS (REPRESENTING NATIONAL INTERESTS) WAS CALLED UPON TO TAKE ACTION TO DRAFT AN ANTI-POLLUTION RESOLUTION, TO FORMULATE EMBRGENCY ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY HEASURES, AND TO DRAFT A RESOLUTION TO THE SIGNATORIES OF THE BERNE CONVENTION ON PREVENTION OF POLLUTION OF THE RHIBE. THE EC COMMISSION (REPRESENTING THE COMMUNITIES AS A WHOLE) IS SERKING, THE AUTHOR STATES, TO ELABORATE A SYSTEM FOR ASSESSING ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS AND A PROGRAM OF ACTION AND CONTROLS.
