Summary:

The letter clarifies the definition of "treatment" under RCRA. In light of that definition, the puncturing, crushing, or shredding of containers holding hazardous waste does not constitute treatment as defined under RCRA.

This is in response to your letter of June 17, 1985, in which you question whether shredding of containers holding toluenes estitutes "treatment" of a vaste under RCM.

Of operse, this interpretation applies only to those States where the Federal MCRA regulations apply. It is intended that the States take control of the hazardous waste program: where a State program is in operation, that State's rules and regulations prevail in lieu. of the Federal program. Virginia was granted final authorisation for their program as of December 1984; thus, it is their rules that apply to your wasten.
