A proposed landfill cell included in the design capacity as described in the Part A permit application may qualify for interim status if the facility - itself qualified for interim status. A proposed landfill cell must be included in the original Part A or it must be approved as a Part A revision subject to \$270.72 conditions before it can qualify for interim status.

Attached is a letter we received from Mr. George Kush of SCA Chemical Services, Inc. requesting a decision on the status of their proposed scientific landfill cells.

The issue raised in the letter concerns whether proposed landfill cells which were included in the design capacity described in the Part A permit application may qualify for interim status. I have reviewed the circumstances described in the Application with CGC and the Office of Enforcement and determined that in cases where a proposed landfill cell is included in the design capacity described in the original part A application, it may qualify for interim status, assuming of course, that the facility qualifies for interim status. If a proposed landfill cell has not been included in the original Part A application, it cannot qualify for interim status unless a revised Part A permit application is submitted and approved subject to the conditions of \$122.23(c). If you have any questions or disagree with my analysis, please contact either Ms. Deborah Welpe or me at 755-9107.

It is appropriate for Region II to respond to the letter, as the facility is located in New York. I therefore have referred hr. Kush to you if he has any further questions.
