

A presentation of all the relevant factors involved in recruiting, employing, training, and advancing more women into higher management positions.

BRINGING WOMEN INTO MANAGEMENT. Francine E. Gordon and Myra H. Strober, eds. 1975. HF5500.2.G67

Intended to encourage and assist top management in bringing more women into management at all levels, particularly the upper echelons of the Corporate world. It provides an intellectual understanding of the issues and practical information on how to implement change.

One woman's analysis of what it means to be a woman in body, in mind and in spirit.

The book discusses modern woman and the varied roles she plays. Not light reading but it is well worth the effort required for anyone interested in how the psychology and biology of a woman makes her tick. It explains the desires, rewards, and cost of the various encounters that are apt to be hers in her womanhood.

This book reflects and clarifies the funny, sad and confused things women and men do and wish for as they cope with the social-sexual ideas and forces of the women's movement. In particular, Ms. West's selections expose for our contemplation the paradoxes and frustrations most of us experience in our relations these days.

This book presents the edited proceedings of a national conference focusing on the need for change in the ways organizations utilize women. This conference concentrated almost exclusively on providing high level managerial and professional opportunities for women already employed.

Examines women's courage in a historical context, showing how it has responded to the varied challenges of American life.

WOMEN TOGETHER. A HISTORY IN DOCUMENTS OF THE WOMEN'S MOVEMENT IN THE UNITED STATES. Judith Papachriston. 1977. Hol426.P34

The crucial documents of the women's movement in the United States, from its beginning a century and a half ago. They are brought together in a single volume to show the myriad ways in which American women, acting together, have struggled to achieve social, political, and economic, equality and independence.

WOMEN, WORK AND VOLUNTEERING. Herta Loeser. 1974. HV91. L62

Addresses the question of the validity of volunteer work, in the climate of the '70s. For those who view it positively, it presents the advantage and disadvantages.

WOMEN'S RIGHTS ALMANAC. A UNIQUE REFERENCE GUIDE ABOUT AND FOR ALL AMERICAN WOMEN. Nancy Gager, ed. 1974. HQ1154.AlW6

The essential book on the past, present and future status of women. The first comprehensive almanac on women's social, political and legal status ever published in the U.S.
