EPA agrees to assist WAVE participants in implementing WAVE by doing the following:


- Develop outreach materials recognizing participants for water efficiency achievements and a commitment to environmental protection.

PAPERWORK REDUCTION ACT

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has approved the information requirements of the WAVE Program under the provisions of the Paperwork Reduction Act, 44 U.S.C. 3501 et seq. and has assigned OMB control number 2040-0164.

Participation in the WAVE Program is voluntary. Legal authority for this collection can be found in 33 U.S.C. 1254(o) (1988). This section of the Clean Water Act authorizes the EPA Administrator to conduct research and investigations to develop methods, devices, systems and policies capable of achieving the maximum reduction of unnecessary water consumption. The WAVE Program is key to reducing unnecessary water consumption, and achieving pollution prevention.

The public reporting and record keeping burden for this collection of information is estimated to range from 15 minutes to nine hours per response. Burden means the total time, effort, or financial resources expended by persons to generate, maintain, retain, or disclose or provide information to or for a Federal agency. This includes the time needed to review instructions; develop, acquire, install, and utilize technology and systems for the purposes of collecting, validating, and verifying information, processing and maintaining information, and disclosing and providing information; adjust the existing ways to comply with any previously applicable instructions and requirements; train personnel to be able to respond to a collection of information; search data sources; complete and review the collection of information; and transmit or otherwise disclose the information. An agency may not conduct or sponsor, and a person is not required to respond to, a collection of information unless it displays a currently valid OMB control number.
